NEW BUSINESS

Presentation from Albert Krause

Approved by County of Camrose, with conditions. Possible annexation into Village of Bittern Lake, extra taxation available, but extra workload. The current plan is for 7 lots as previously discussed.

Reference was made to a map previously provided by City of Camrose. Anjah referred to County Council not having an issue with annexation into Bittern Lake, if it was an uncontested annexation. There is a property on the quarter section that could cause a concern. Possible single parcel sub-division of 7 lots for now, then annex just this parcel into Village border, by writing to the Minister of Municipal Affairs, copy to County, possible cost of under \$500 to do the application. Information is required.

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If it is contested then we would need a different planner, as she cannot represent both sides. The current subdivision is valid until May 2017, he could apply for another extension, he has concerns with the conditions placed by Camrose Municipal Planning Commission, if he does not want to comply he could let the subdivision die naturally in May, or start a new subdivision, the conditions could end up with the some of the same, unless Transportation change their minds on the intersection or Council were to change their minds on some conditions. It may not make any difference, ultimately if annexed in first, it can be dealt with on one board.

As the road belongs to Bittern, servicing belongs to the Village it makes sense for the Tax dollars to be paid to the Village too.

He is open to more development in that area, therefore it makes more sense to annex the whole quarter section. The County would not want a quarter section back to them, as it does not make economical sense. Timeline for development, once approval is received perhaps in the New Year, it would depend on Government approval for an annexation. May need to be rezoned, along with other considerations according to Bittern Lake Bylaws and not County.

Municipal development plan would be required under new MGA. He feels an answer from Council, the sooner the better. There are still several factors to take into account, roads, drainage, water, sewer and more. Decision of Council if they wish to annex the ground into Bittern Lake boundary, this would be the first step. New Council since this was first bought to Council. Would he have to re-submit or accept the application as previously submitted. Access road was mentioned, and this needs to be looked at and agreed upon, where? Municipal Government has ultimate power over annexing parcels of land, they can mitigate, if uncontested then all should go smoothly. Suggestion was to talk to the land owner about changes, keep the land use the same as current for the owner. Council thanked both Albert and Anjah and they both left at 8:40pm There is a lot of information within the development, it has been ongoing for several years. The conditions of a contribution towards an intersection development. Restrictions on accesses from proposed properties. The access cannot be next to the pumphouse, as the land will not cope with it. Martin Ave is not designed for a lot of traffic use, need to look at other options. Alberta Transportation has put conditions on the intersection with South Bittern Lake Road and Highway 13, it could need to be changed with increased traffic in the future. Any funds taken from future developments will contribute to this, so that the funds are available when any upgrade is required.

Before a decision can be made, Council request a training session with the County Planning Authority (Anja Howard), to be able to make a fully informed decision. Mayor Debnam made a motion for CAO to arrange a training session.
